## VINTAGE WHITE

Vintage White is a beautiful blend, designed to emulate the look and feel of an antique, weathered, and broken in brick, with the reliability and strength of a newly manufactured brick.

## COLOR & TEXTURE RANGE

Vintage White is, by design, composed of a range of off-white tones and textures. Unlike white painted, or heavily smeared brick, Vintage White is not intended to, and will **NOT** create a panel with highly uniform colors or textures. Rather, the use of Vintage White for a brick wall will create a panel full of character, containing varying tones of white, and a range of unique textures. This is a consequence of our design choices, as well as our unique artisanal manufacturing process. Variation in color and texture within an Old Texas Brick, brick panel are to be expected. ## TRANSPARENCY

As a result of the decoration process used to manufacture Vintage White, when the blend is humid and/or wet, it appears "transparent". Vintage White "transparency" refers to the ability to see the base color of the brick, which can be a blend of pink, cream, yellow and/or light grey. Due to the multiple stops brick makes from the manufacturing plant until its final location, as well as the humidity brick naturally absorbs during installation, it's extremely likely that a Vintage White brick panel will be humid and/or wet after installation, therefore, appearing will appear "transparent". 6-8 weeks after installation, a Vintage White brick panel should be fully dry, and display the intended off-white color range, however, depending on the climate conditions brick is subjected to, it may take longer. ## NATURE OF WHITE BRICK

Just the same way that a stain is much more apparent on a White Shirt, when compared to a Light Brown or Grey Shirt, Vintage White and generally speaking, all white brick, is much more prone to **SHOW** stains, as opposed to **HIDE** them. That is the nature of White Brick. Construction Jobsites and Brick Yards are locations with an abundance of ambient dirt, water and humidity, resulting in the high likelihood of any white construction material, including our Vintage White, to become stained while laying idle. Even when taking extreme precautionary measures, such as covering pallets, or keeping them under roofs, because of the nature of White Brick, Vintage White is still highly prone to staining. Old Texas Brick is not liable for any stains on Vintage White brick that occur subsequent to it being delivered to an Old Texas Brick Distributor or Final Customer. Any required cleaning and/or retouching required on a Vintage White brick subsequent to its delivery is the sole responsibility of the Final Customer.
